Senators Elizabeth Warren (D-Mass.) and Cory Gardner (R-Colo.) introduced a bipartisan bill that would allow states to regulate marijuana without federal interference. The <u>STATES Act</u> would amend the Controlled Substances Act to include a framework that says it no longer applies to those following state, territory, or tribal laws.

<u>S2720</u> has been introduced to **New Jersey** Senate to legalize possession and personal use of marijuana for persons aged 21 and over. The bill also creates a Division of Marijuana Enforcement and licensing structure.

A strong partisan bill has been introduced in **Delaware**, <u>HB110</u>, to amend Title 16 and Title 30 of the Delaware Code, creating the Delaware marijuana Control Act.

A **California** Assembly Bill has been introduced to add and repeal Section 11361.9 of the Health and Safety Code relating to cannabis. <u>AB2520</u> would create the California Illegal Cannabis Task Force, which would analyze existing statutes to determine if they adequately address illegal cannabis cultivation, manufacturing, distribution, sales, and diversion of cannabis to other states. This committee would also recommend necessary revisions or new provisions.

**Colorado** Governor officially passed a bill to allow school nurses to administer medical marijuana to students with medical marijuana registry cards while at school. Click here to learn more about HB1286.

A moderate partisan bill has been introduced in **Maine**. <u>LD1064</u> is an act that would require that health insurance policies cover medical marijuana.
