Results of the 2018 Primary Elections:

The following states have legalized Medical Cannabis: **Missouri** (<u>Amendment 2</u>), **Utah** (<u>Prop. 2</u>),

The following states have legalized Adult-Use Cannabis: **Michigan** (Proposal 1)

A bill has been introduced in **New York**, <u>SB 9189</u>, relates to providing insurance coverage for medical marijuana users.

<u>Senate Bill 2275</u> has progressed in **Illinois**, creating marijuana legalization Referendum Act. Requiring the State Board of Elections to cause a statewide question to be submitted on opinions of legalization in the state.

November 12th

A partisan bill in Texas has been introduced, proposing a constitutional amendment to authorize and regulate the possession, cultivation, and sale of cannabis. Read more about <u>SJR8</u>.

- House Bill 63 was also introduced, relating to the civil and criminal penalties for possession of certain small amounts of marijuana and an exception to prosecution for possession. – As well as <u>SB156</u>.
- House Bill 122 Provides an affirmative defense to prosecution for possession of marijuana.
- House Bill 209 Authorizing the possession, use, cultivation, distribution, transportation, and delivery of medical cannabis for medical use for qualifying patients; also for licensing of dispensing organizations and testing facilities.



November 16th

<u>AB 3506</u>, introduced Nov. 7 in **New York**, enacts the "Marihuana regulation and taxation act"; makes technical changes regarding the definition of marihuana; relates to the qualification of certain consumption, display, production or distribution of marijuana.

November 21

Lawmakers in **New Jersey** have introduced and progressed a bill to legalize cannabis in the state. <u>\$2730</u> would legalize possession and personal use of an ounce or less of cannabis by adults.
